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5. Many of our classes are "hands on" classes. This requires space; however, physical space for classes at times is problematic with classes being held in less than ideal spaces. In addition, storage space for material used in these classes is extremely limited. Lack of resources also includes not having the finances to order the various assessments faculty need.

## **6. Opportunities**

1. We stated as a challenge the number of adjuncts we hire to cover field supervision and how it would be best if we could use our fulltime faculty for field supervision. This academic year (2022-2023), we have a smaller junior block class. We currently have one block, not two. This will give us the experience of using more full time faculty and less adjunct faculty for supervision.

2. Our Reading Center is ready for a "face lift". We have faculty interested in meeting with our fund raiser to look for permanent funds for the center. A fully funded center will be a valuable community resource and a great opportunity for our faculty and students to make a difference.

3. We are currently working on submitting a dual licensed online program completion program for our two undergraduate programs in K-6 and Special Education K-12. We are hoping to meet a need of ADE's to increase teachers in the field while at the same time, increasing our SCCH within the department.

## **7. Summary**

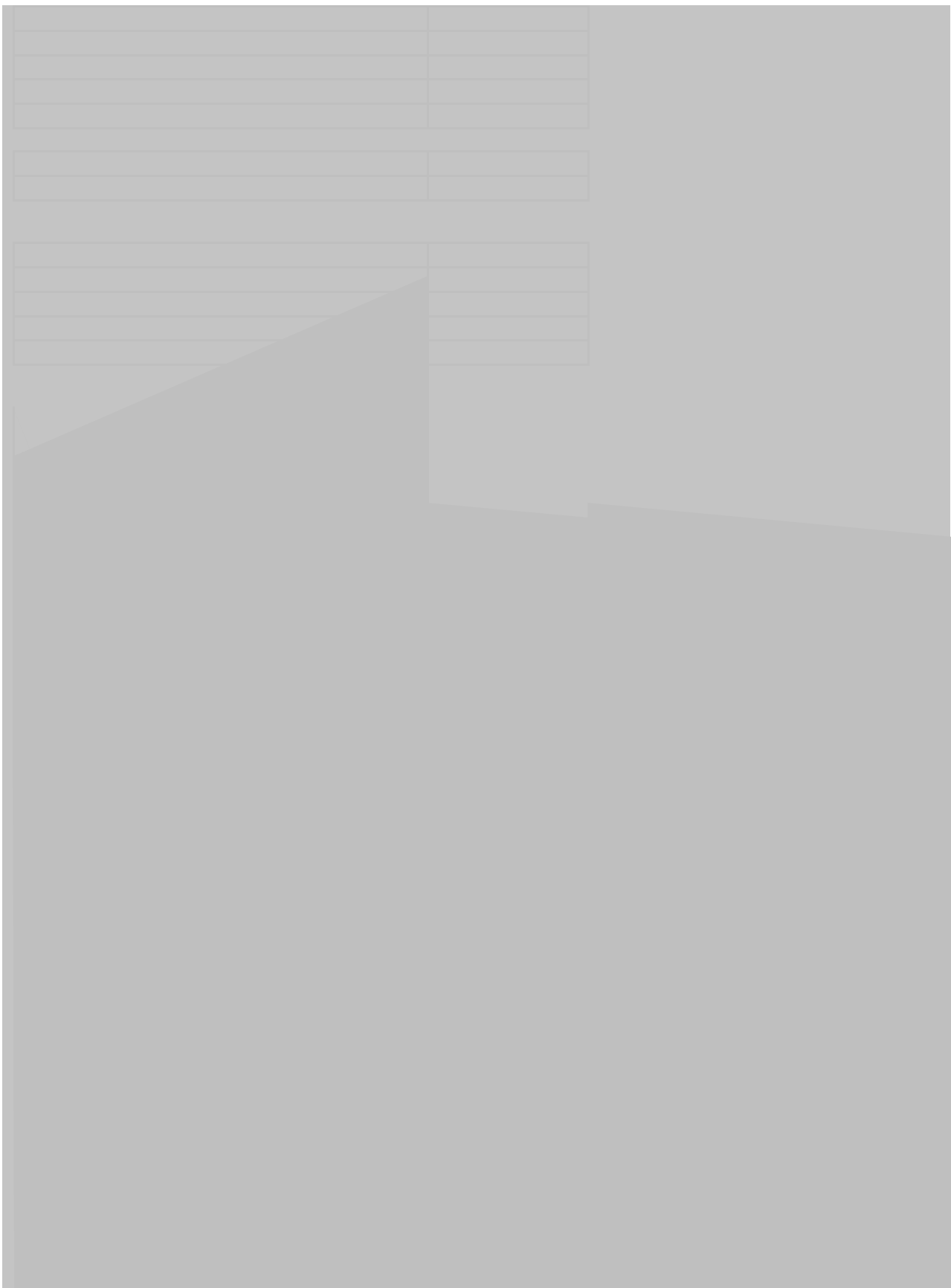
